Garbage

Please put out by 8:30 AM on the designated day, in the designated bag.
Note: Items that cannot fit in the designated bag will go "bulk garbage."

Burnable Garbage

Raw Garbage
Drain any water and put in the garbage bag

Seafood Shells

Tempura Oil
Permeated Cloth or Paper
Solidified by Coagulant

Cold Pack

Desiccant

Stuffed Animals

Disposable Diapers
(Remove Waste)

Commercial Pet Sand

Leather/Rubber Products

Garden Tree Pruning Garbage – Leaves, Woodchips, Grass, etc.
Within 5 cm diameter, up to 50 cm length
Note: Remove soil and let dry

Plastic Products
Ex: Plastic toys, cutting boards, buckets, wash basins, hangers, CDs, DVDs, planters

Video Tapes **Cassette Tapes** **Ink Ribbons**

Plastic Containers & Packaging Items with a Pla-mark

Trays

Containers for Mouthwash, Eyedrops, etc.

Plastic Bags

Plastic Lids

Individual wrappers, such as candy

Wrap for food items and convenience store box lunches, outer film for cup noodles, etc.

Packs such as egg cartons, packs for fruits, ham, etc.

Partitioned trays, such as for candy and seaweed

Nets for oranges, onions, etc.

Styrofoam, sheets for protecting products such as fruits, home appliances, etc.

Empty the contents and rinse with water

- *1 – Items with non-removable dirt go to "burnable waste"
- *2 – Please remove caps and lids.
- *3 – Please do not double-bag.
- *4 – Please remove any non-plastic materials, such as paper labels, to the best of your ability

Non-burnable Garbage

Lighters
(completely empty the content)

Small Appliances
(remove batteries, put in harmful garbage)
(cut cords to within 50 cm)

Metal Products
(remove all content inside)

Aluminum Foil
(soiled)

Plastic Containers

Mirrors

Needles/Cutlery
(wrap in paper and put in garbage bag)

Ceramics
(wrap broken items in paper and put in garbage bag)

Glass Products

Light Bulbs

Floppy/Mini Discs

Disposable Heat Packs

Umbrella Frames
(remove umbrella cloth, to "burnable garbage")

Printers
(items that cannot fit in the specified bag go to "bulk garbage")

Diatomaceous Earth Mat

Harmful Garbage

Batteries

Batteries □ Please utilize storefront collection for button cell batteries (mercury included), small rechargeable batteries (NiCd, lithium ion, nickel hydrogen)

Mercury Thermometer

Fluorescent Tubes

Straight Tube, Round Tube, Light Bulb-type Fluorescent Lamps
□ Incandescent light bulbs, LED lights are "non-burnable garbage"



Paper Remove any materials that are not paper

Cardboard
Cross section w/wave shape
Remove any adhesive tape

Drink Cartons
Cartons that are silver inside are "burnable garbage"

Misc. Paper That Cannot Be Recycled:
Wrap cores, vinyl-coated paper, wax-processed paper, paper with adhesives, photographs, synthetic paper, waterproof paper, thermal paper, carbon paper, odorized paper, foil-pushed paper, Japanese paper (calligraphy paper), shredded paper

Misc. Paper
(Magazines, Other Used Paper)

Cloth



Old clothes, blankets, sheets, towels, curtains, lace
 Note: Can be discarded inside of a bag
 Note: Futons are "bulk garbage"

Aluminum Cans


Steel Cans

 Dirt that cannot be removed is "non-burnable garbage"

Canned Food Lids
(diameter of 7 cm or greater)

Metal Caps
(diameter of 7 cm or greater)

(separate into aluminum/steel and put out)

Spray Cans/Cassette Cylinders



As the collection date and location for each resource collection facility, such as supermarkets, differs, please refer to the table above.

Note: Completely empty the spray can's, Cassette Cylinders contents, and put out without opening a hole in it.

If spray cans and cassette cylinders that are not completely empty are exposed to the scorching summer heat, they may exceed the proper storage temperature. Please do not put non-emptied spray cans and cassette cylinders into the flexible containers, as this is dangerous.
